Highlights from Recent Board Meeting Minutes

While we may have had a few minor issues since, our facilities have been doing better than most. We are hopeful that it can stay that way through the winter months and moving forward in the future.


We look forward to a New Year ahead and would like to wish everyone the best!

Maintenance and Grounds Team


Fall has come and past and now we are moving into the on set of the winter months. The maintenance department has been preparing for snow with shovels and ice melt available at all entrances to the facilities.


















Dietary Services


