# **Administration**

## **Updates from the Board**

There was a board meeting on January 24<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Some highlights from this meeting were:

- Board motion to purchase a new John Deere Utility
   Tractor (with a bucket). This will allow maintenance to
   better maintain the parking lots in the winter.
- Board Motion to approve the purchase of a new floor scrubber.
- Many policies have been amended or updated and some new policies have been approved.
- Prices were sought for a camera system. This could be an expensive endeavour, but the board wishes to pursue it further.

Board Meeting Minutes are posted on a bulletin board at the front of Hillcrest for anyone that wishes to take a look.

There have been many changes made to seniors housing legislation, and BDSHA has had a busy month updating all of our paperwork to reflect these changes.

Bid Packages have been released for two separate projects:

Utility Door Replacement- James and Della Roach Park

Manor

Funding Provided as part of a federal grant.

Suite Renewals – Cabinet Replacement – Golden Crest Manor and Barrhead Community Housing

 This is funded by ASHC and it is part of an ongoing effort to renew many of the government owned properties. ASHC specifies the properties to receive this funding and the management body determines the units to receive renewal. We are hopeful that there is enough funding to complete cabinet replacements in two units in Golden Crest Manor and three Community Housing units in Barrhead.

## **New Med Room**

Work has been occurring to move the med room closer to the heart of BDSHA Operations. It will soon be located beside the new Activities Office. We are hopeful that this should assist Home Care with providing better service to the residents.

## **Resident Feedback**

I have said this many times before.....

We want to provide the best possible accommodations and services for our Residents at BDSHA. To achieve this, constant resident feedback is CRUCIAL. I have heard many residents say that they don't want to complain, but that

doesn't help us to improve. If we aren't aware of problems, then we can't fix them.

Simply put...... If you have an issue with anything at BDSHA, WE WANT TO HEAR IT.

Feedback is best when it is put in writing. There are suggestion boxes located at the Front of Hillcrest and Klondike Place, and you can also drop a letter off at the front desk. Even a conversation with Dawn (Resident Services Manager) is helpful, because she will document any concerns and ensure they are addressed.

It is well known that there are issues with the new menu. We fully expected this. It wasn't going to be perfect right away and changes would be necessary. This will take some time though, so please be patient and continue to let us know when you enjoy a meal, or if you would rather not have certain items on the menu.

## Please Be Kind to Your Neighbours

BDSHA is comprised of several different properties. Many are attached through pedways and Links. This is a luxury that is sometimes taken for granted. The connection of Hillcrest, Golden Crest Manor, Jubilee Manor, and Klondike Place enables us to travel indoors to visit friends and participate in events and activities spread all over. It also allows our residents and tenants to walk the halls in comfort and exercise in the cold Alberta winter months.

Unless posted otherwise, every Resident and Tenant who resides at a BDSHA Seniors Housing Facility is permitted to

participate in events held in any building. There are no exclusive properties.

We would like to remind everyone to be kind to your neighbours. Whether they live in the same property, or down the hall in another one. While we understand that it is unrealistic to expect so many people with different personalities to interact without some issues, BDSHA will not tolerate any abusive behavior towards other residents or staff. There simply is no excuse or need for it.

If you have issues with other residents or staff, please report them to our Resident Services Manager, Dawn Price. As many of you already know, she is great at her job and will be more than happy to work with you to solve any conflicts peacefully.

food preparation

- housekeeping services for a resident's personal living space
- · laundry services for a resident's personal items
- activities (social programmer)

Please note that this only relates to residents whose income is sufficiently large enough that that they usually have to pay taxes. If you do not normally have taxable income, there will be no benefit to making a claim for medical expenses. If you think you might benefit from this, please see Su in the office to request a letter for your tax preparer.

Congrats to Zoie Parks for the promotion to Resident Service Aide and welcome to Tia Kochan to Reception, she is taking Zoie's place.



# **Housekeeping & Laundry Department**

## **Hello Everyone!**


Our annual cleans (Hillcrest and Klondike Place) will be starting the first week of February, we will be sending out notices 24 hours in advance so you know when we will be coming. When we do our annual cleans, we will also be defrosting refrigerators to clean them out, a reminder will be sent out with your 24-hour notice.

Let's talk about recycling! Recycling Joe comes out twice a month to empty the recycling and take away what we have collected. The time in between, it is up to us to keep that area clean. While housekeeping does tend to it daily, we also need help from our residents. By following these guidelines, you can help us make this an easier process.

- We do not recycle glass, no pickle jars, jam jars, peanut/nut jars, or cheese whiz jars, it goes in with your garbage please.
- 2. Cardboard needs to be put with your garbage, we do not have a recycling program for it.

- 3. Please recycle plastic only if it has a number 1-7 and the recycling symbol on the bottom, any other plastic is garbage. We do not recycle plastic bags, clamshells, plastic cups, plates, or cutlery. If it does not have a number, please throw it in the garbage.
- 4. We do not recycle Styrofoam.
- 5. Please do not throw food aluminum cans (tuna, beans, canned meat) in with the pop cans. They are not recyclable, they are garbage.
- 6. No garbage of any kind should be put in the recycling. The recycling gets sorted through by Recycling Joe and it can be a messy job. Please throw out your garbage in your room and housekeeping will pick it up.

This is what the symbol on the bottom of your plastic container will look like, if it does not have one of these symbols, it is garbage.

\*We have been receiving your feedback and have been altering the menu/recipes to better cater to our residents.


\*We hope all residents are feeling the love in the air and are getting excited for Valentines Day, we will be having a special meal on Feb 14, 2023 lunch.


