A team player is required for a challenging job position in a sometimes-stressful setting. The contract will be for the rest of your life.



Administration

Updates From the Board

- A Housing Needs Assessment will be conducted by BDSHA. Information from this will allow the organization to determine a path forward that will benefit the area best.
- The board has determined that Lodge Rental Rates will remain unchanged for the upcoming year. This will be reviewed again next spring. The cost of operations will eventually lead to an increase at some point.

BDSHA TV Channel

If you tune to Channel 397 or 398 on your Shaw Cable TV, BDSHA now has a channel for news and announcements. This will be a valuable communication tool to convey information regarding events and activities. Eventually we are hoping that the weekly menu will even be displayed, but this will happen after the Spring Menu is approved by the Dietitian.

The BDSHA channels show up as SECTV on the guide.
Unfortunately, we are unable to change this or the location

in the guide. If residents are having issues with the picture, the settings on the TV may require adjustment. Contact our front desk for Assistance with this.

In addition to this, there is now a screen at the Front Reception Desk for resident and guest information.

BDSHA will be hiring a contractor to complete this work over the summer.


Landscaping


Welcome all the new residents that have recently moved in. I'm sure some will be recognized by many residents.

Spring is here! With the warmer temperatures maintenance has seen a lot of water issues in some of the buildings. We thank you greatly for your patience as we continue to monitor any reoccurring problems that may arise. Although afternoons are beginning to be warmer the evenings are still cool, because of this we have yet to reduce the temperatures of the buildings.

If you have a personal AC in your suite, please call the main office and at the beginning of the month we will be happy to install it for you. If purchasing new, we recommend you buy a stand up unit and not a window frame unit.

You will see clean up happening around each building. Waterers have been set out, grass has been trimmed and raking is being done. Should you have any concerns about growing areas or are interested in tending to plants this

coming summer please speak with the Activity Department. The Activity Department may have spaces/pots that you may use for this growing season.

Maintenance has had some system issues regarding Klondike Place and the fire alarm. The problem (we hope) has been solved. We apologize for the inconvenience to all residents. A reminder coming from this is due to the warmer weather, there will be annual fire drills taking place in all buildings. Please take these drills seriously and participate. Not only are these drills mandatory, but we also want to ensure that the resident and staff safety is taken seriously. All residents are expected to evacuate the building during a fire alarm drill.

Housekeeping & Laundry Department

Hello Everyone!

We have finally made it to spring, and with spring comes, melting snow, mud, and dirty floors. If you have not already seen, the housekeeping department has acquired a shiny new scrubber! Our team has gone through the training and because of its size, this machine will primarily be used in the new Hillcrest building and Klondike Place. It is definitely a step up from our older scrubber and one that we will definitely have fun using!

We have started our annual cleans for 2023 and like last year, you will be given a notice on when your home will be cleaned. It is not necessary to leave while the cleaning is being done, however we do ask that you make room for our team to come in and clean for you. On the back of your notice is an evaluation, we love to hear how we did and if we can make improvements in the future.

When we did our linen order a few weeks ago we decided to try something new this year! We are bringing in navy blue towels to replace the white ones! Its nice to throw in a little color and they wash very well! Once we get our order in, we will start distributing them out to replace the white towels. Recycling is still proving to be an issue in all of our building. Please help us out by following the guidelines below.

- 1. We do not recycle glass, no pickle jars, jam jars, peanut/nut jars, or cheese whiz jars, it goes in with your garbage please.
- 2. Cardboard needs to be put with your garbage, we do not have a recycling program for it.
- 3. Please recycle plastic only if it has a number 1-7 and the recycling symbol on the bottom, any other plastic is garbage. We do not recycle plastic bags, clamshells, plastic cups, plates, or cutlery. If it does not have a number, please throw it in the garbage.
- 4. We do not recycle Styrofoam.
- 5. Please do not throw food aluminum cans (tuna, beans, canned meat) in with the pop cans. They are not recyclable, they are garbage.
- 6. No garbage of any kind should be put in the recycling. The recycling gets sorted through by Recycling Joe and it can be a messy job. Please throw out your garbage in your room and housekeeping will pick it up.

This is what the symbol on the bottom of your plastic container will look like, if it does not have one of these symbols, it is garbage.



A small project we are working on this spring is updating and replacing the curtains in our building. We have been given swatches to look through and hope to have decisions made soon.

Housekeeping will be cleaning the resident smoke shack weekly and emptying the ashtrays twice a week, if you notice that it needs attention in between the weekly cleans please let the front desk know.


