

Blue Canadian Rockies – Wilf Carter


In the blue <u>Canadian</u> Rockies





Maintenance and Grounds Department

Winter is in full swing, and the temperatures are not being very consistent. There have been many days that were warmer, then in the middle of January there was a week of very cold weather causing the boilers to work overtime to maintain heat in all the buildings. Please do not hesitate to call the maintenance department with any heating concerns, we respond to these very quickly and take them very seriously.

As a friendly reminder the heat that is provided in your suites is radiant heat. This means that hot water radiates from your baseboard heaters to warm the areas in your room. There is no forced air. You have full and complete control of your thermostat. The response time of the thermostat is slower in comparison to a regular household furnace because it takes time for the water to warm up or cool off depending on moving your thermostat up or down.

The temperatures outside are being quite variable. Please dress according to the weather with proper footwear and when walking outside please be sure to be careful and report if any sidewalks or entrances need to be cleared or salted. We would like to thank everyone very much with helping coordinate cleaning the parking lots. If your vehicles

are removed in a timely matter, we can do a better job clearing the areas for you to have better access to your vehicles.

There are many things to look forward too with the upcoming spring. Outside furniture for the new landscaped areas have arrived and we will be building them throughout the winter months so they can be put out to enjoy the beautiful new areas.

The scooter shed has been a concern in the past with the door being open. We would like to remind everyone that it does not automatically close behind you when you open it. Please close the door when you have left the building. If you accidently hit your button from your room, the door will open. Please insure we are keeping the door closed, not only for theft but for the heating system inside the building.

We look forward to the last half of winter and into the spring season. Please if there is anything concerning the maintenance department do not hesitate to speak with the office so we can provide you with the best service possible. Stay warm and safe!

We are purchasing a sparkly new washing machine for our laundry department this month; Jodi is very excited and is eagerly awaiting its arrival.


Please make sure when it is your day for a weekly clean that your laundry is easily available for Jodi and that your sheets are accessible. If you are still in bed, we cannot complete your laundry for that day, and you will end up waiting until the following week. We appreciate your cooperation!

Let's talk about recycling! Recycling Joe comes out twice a month to empty the recycling and take away what we have collected. The time in between, it is up to us to keep that area clean. While housekeeping does tend to it daily, we also need help from our residents. By following these guidelines, you can help us make this an easier process.

- 1. We do not recycle glass, no pickle jars, jam jars, peanut/nut jars, or cheese whiz jars, it goes in with your garbage please.
- 2. Cardboard needs to be put with your garbage, we do not have a recycling program for it.
- 3. Please recycle plastic only if it has a number 1-7 and the recycling symbol on the bottom, any other plastic is garbage. We do not recycle plastic bags, clamshells, plastic cups, plates, or cutlery. If it does not have a number, please throw it in the garbage.
- 4. We do not recycle Styrofoam.
- 5. Please do not throw food aluminum cans (tuna, beans, canned meat) in with the pop cans. They are not recyclable, they are garbage.
- 6. No garbage of any kind should be put in the recycling.

 The recycling gets sorted through by Recycling Joe and it can be a messy job. Please throw out your garbage in your room and housekeeping will pick it up.

This is what the symbol on the bottom of your plastic container will look like, if it does not have one of these symbols, it is garbage.
